What is a Club Mentor?

A Club Mentor takes a personal interest in and helps a newly chartered club to survive



- The Mentor serves as a role model, coach, confidante, offering knowledge insight, perspective or wisdom used to the club and members
- Up to two (2) Mentors per club

Mentoring a new Toastmasters club is similar in many ways to mentoring a single person

Mentors are the advisors and tutors for new clubs and have a great effect on the degree to which a new club succeeds

Level of commitment – at least 6-12 months after the club is chartered


