5. LGET's MESSAGE

5.1 District Officers Trainings

LGET DTM Dr Khong mentioned that there would be a District Officers Training (DOT) that day with a second session later in the term. She asked the meeting if they would prefer having more than just two DOTs per term.

5.2 Club Officers Trainings

She also highlighted that there would Club Officers Trainings at Division levels to be conducted in the new term.

5.3 LGET Task Force

She outlined her plan to form a LGET Task Force that would comprise some 10 qualified veteran toastmasters to assist in mapping the training programmes for the year. To-date about 6 had accepted and more email invites would be going out soon to the short-listed toastmasters.

5.4 Educational Goals

She flashed the report tabled by LGET Arul for District 51 and extrapolated from there to obtain the benchmarks for the term 2004/2005.

She expressed confidence that the numbers required based on per capita computation should be easily achievable by the new District.

6. LGM's MESSAGE

6.1 Club Building

LGM DTM Poh Kim Siong maintained that he would continue the dream of having every area achieving one new club for the term. He targeted a goal of 50 new clubs for the District.

6.2 Membership Growth

He cited last term's achievement by District 51 in recruiting 3,000 new members. He pro-rated the figures and planned to achieve 1,800 new members in his term of office.

6.3 Semi-Annual Dues

He further reiterated his wish to ensure compliance of the goals set by TI for timely submission of membership dues according to the April/October deadlines.

7. TABLING OF MOTIONS

- 7.1 That District 80 shall hold the following speech contests:

7.2 That District 80 shall, with regards to Speech Contests Policy, have every area with 4 or less clubs be entitled to sending 2 contestants to the Area Contests; and every division with less than 4 areas be entitled to sending 2 contestants to the Division Contests.

8. DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION

- 8.1 DS DTM Michael Rodrigues informed the meeting that the Secretariat was at its formative stage with two members already inducted into the team. More toastmasters would be invited to join in order to handle the mammoth task ahead, assisting the efforts of the LGET and LGM in pursuit of their goals.
- 8.2 He assured the meeting that the Secretariat would strive to do their best for District 80; and exhorted all members to "contact us and query us for any assistance needed".
- 8.3 He cited the problem encountered by corporate clubs in particular with regards to submission of dues. Because of organisational red tape, some in-house clubs had problems meeting the deadlines. He promised assistance from the Secretariat to such clubs in coping with the payments [prior the organisations' reimbursement].
- 8.4 For the District Directory, he appealed to all club officers to submit their full list as soon for production of the directory in hardcopies by Aug 04.

10. DISTRICT NEWSLETTERS

DPRO DTM Lyn Desker outlined the tasks of her Team to produce the District Newsletter. It would carry the standard key messages from the top district management and special features on major events undertaken by Divisions from various countries/regions. She requested all Division officers and members to submit appropriate articles for the newsletters. Editing of such input would be the sole discretion of the PRO and her Team.

BUDGET AND CLAIMS

- 11.1 DTSR Wong Jian Bing informed that the working principles of his treasury committee would be tailored along "3 guidebooks"
 - a) Professional guidelines from TI,
 - b) Guidance from top district leaders,
 - c) Personal advice from Past District Treasurer, DTM Poh Kim Siong.
- 11.2 He informed that the full budget would be prepared and tabled at the next Council Meeting.

11.3 He gave out copies of the 'Treasury Handbook' to Division Governors for reference. Softcopy would be available by email upon request with contact details. He brought the attention of the meeting to page 2 of Handbook with regards to the allocation of funds to Divisions. The reimbursable amount for each club is US\$100 for membership registry at 20 and above, and US\$80 for registry below 20.

12. QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS SESSION

12.1 John Seah of ITMA (585485) commented that most contestants taking part in District Contests harboured the hope to win. However, the learning process had been slow and unstructured in the past. He called for the institution of a programme to prepare and mentor future speech contestants to prepare them for the world stage.

LGET Dr Khong responded that such an initiative was already being taken by her Task Force to round up seasoned contestants as mentors. The 10 July event is a step in the right direction to groom candidates for the 2008 championship. Focus would be centred on understanding the external environment and culture of the championship platform.

12.2 Barnabas Cheung, DVG H, reflected the aspiration of the Mandarin clubs to have an extra day of programme for their constituent members.

LGM Poh agreed to further explore the proposal with the D51 team and would revert subsequently.

12.3 Goh Wei Koon, DVG Z, queried on the timing of submission of Division claims.

DTSR Wong responded that the DOT 1, to be convened later that afternoon, would provide the opportunity for elaboration on the subject.

12.4 DTM James Lim, DVG D, surfaced his concern on the frequent clashes of workshops and programmes at Divisional levels. That had resulted in reduced attendance in certain events affecting the morale of organisers. He called for a plan to streamline the activities and resources to better serve the interests of all members.

LGET Dr Khong replied that she would invite short-listed members into the committee to brainstorm and mapped out a year plan for the District on a 'borderless' basis. Each of her members would aim to conduct 3 workshops, making a total of 33 over the whole term. Such events would likely be scheduled on a Saturday afternoon.

LGET Task Force

12.5 Jackson Chua, DVG U, confessed his tribulation in taking the new role, but nonetheless shared his ideals to see a more unified and committed fellowship from all toastmasters. He hoped to see more free and easy trips being packaged to visit other Divisions outside of the Conventions proper.

LGM Poh resounded with a clear support that "Anything Is Possible".

12.6 LGM Poh announced that PDG D51 DTM Dr John Lau, a member of Chua Chu Kang TMC (7702), would run for International Directorship at the Reno Convention this August.

The next Executive Council meeting would take place at Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia in November 2004.
